comments that the original stoppage thus probably occurred only due to an oversight, but that the Ministry has now "taken refuge" in a protracted search for the original arrangements for passing on the reports. The CRO adds that the Sino-Indian talks in Peiping or some other factor has possibly influenced the present attitude, and that the United Kingdom High Commissioner will continue to press for a resumption of the transmittal of these reports.
