#### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Department has prepared Credentials for South Africa's delegation to the Extension and Review Conference of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty which will be held in New York, from 17 April to 12 May 1995.
- 1.2 South Africa became a State Party to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty on 10 July 1991.
- 1.3 Please note that the Minister of Foreign Affairs does not need Credentials to attend the Conference. Should the Minister decide to attend the Conference, the Department will prepare a separate Note to the

Conference Secretariat to inform the Conference that the Minister will attend and lead the delegation.

- 1.4 The Department proposes that the South African delegation should comprise:
  - The Minister (if it is decided that he should attend);
  - Ambassador KJ Jele, Permanent Representative, New York (Leader of the delegation);
  - Mr TF Wheeler, Chief-Director : Multilateral
    Affairs (Deputy Leader);
    - Mr P Goosen, Minister (Disarmament), South African Mission to the United Nations, Geneva. Mr Goosen has been intimately involved in preparing and developing the South African position on the extension issue and he participates in the work of the Conference on Disarmament in Geneva. Most of the representatives from other countries will, as in the case of the previous NPT meetings, be drawn from the delegations to the Conference on Disarmament in Geneva;
  - Mr Abdul Minty, the advisor to the Minister on nuclear issues;
  - Mr FO Bergh, Minister : South African Mission to the United Nations, New York;
  - Mr JA Davies, Counsellor : South African Mission The Mission is accredited Vienna. in to the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) which is responsible for the implementation of the NPT issues dealt with safeguards. The at the Conference and South Africa's positions will have a direct bearing on South Africa's bid to be designated to the IAEA Board of Governors in June 1995;
    - Mr JP du Preez, Departmental Desk Officer : Non-Proliferation Affairs;
    - Dr N von Wielligh, Senior Manager : Licensing and Safeguards, Atomic Energy Corporation. Dr Von

Wielligh, who has extensive knowledge on safeguards and who would be able to focus on the work of the Third Main Committee dealing with peaceful uses of nuclear energy.
