

- Jo. Although BAD SACHSA wen discussed with BREE for a full hour he failed to tell us that he had paid at least four visits to the scene of most intense activity in March and April 1945. His recent trips to BAD SACHSA were discovered a few hours later from his confiscated disries and notebooks.
- in April 1945. Buring the preceding interrogation BREE had said that he "had heard" from others that General BORNERGER had hidden important V-2 documents in a forest near BAD SACHSA and that a few days after the capture of that town some Germans had gone to the forest with American officers and had dug up the buried documents. An hour later BREE, when asked where he had obtained his information, said that BORNERGER himself had told him that he buried some boxes in the forest at the beginning of April 1945.
- that he had ever anything to do with V-2 documents. This statement he has been asked to correct in writing. According to information received in the United States "Stab KANMLER" had taken care of all these documents in Spring 1945.
- Mountains in Spring 1945. On 27 February 1947 BAEK drew a chart of Kammillan's organisation at Bab Sachsa in March and april 1945. BREE was in charge of one of the three groups. - 36. Records of the tests carried out by SORG with this fuse must have been in one of the 27 cases which BORG bid foot Col. PETERSEN in Spring 1945. The records of the "Development" carried out in part under the direction of KANMLER himself must also have been preserved since BREE sareed that this was the most valuable part of the work done at BAD SACESA in March and April 1945.
- 37. BREE disclaims any direct knowledge of the fate of these and similar records. It is not impossible, however, that he has seen some of them recently, possibly at BAD SACHSA Itself. (Para 30.)
- 38. Documents Setrieved by BREE Recently from the WESER? The first item in balk's confisonted documents and papers proved illuminating. It was a letter with the heading FRESERBUNDE, 11.2.47", addressed to Dipl. Ing. Emil SIEGERT, IMMENSSE bei LEHRTE Mr. 60. (See pare 67). In his letter BREE save as his own address a tender in the port of WESERMONDE. It appears that he was there recently. WASHINGTON had learned that a large part of KREMKYER's documents, dealing with all the development of the Luftwaffe, had been concepted somewhere near the WESER, possibly at WESERM NDE BREE denied this with us. He spoke of having fished out of the water (ans Land gebracht) something he doesn't specify and told SIEGERT in the letter that he had sent this unspecified item to him as a first installment. He followed this eryptic sentence with the expression of regret that hone of the interested people had been able to "gain access to the other archives".
- (HOTE: One rumour had it that V-2 or guided missiles documents had, in part, been hidden under water. This letter may refer to these documents. If this guess is correct it means that BREE recently retrieved one of the containers from the river WEDER or from the port of WESERM NDE where he frequently stays on a neval tender. It would also mean that some of the documents thus hiden are inaccessible to former German Luftwaffe personnel.) DATE STATE AS A

- A2. Present Location and Activities of German Duftwaffe Scientists and V-2 Experts. After BREE's departure for BUSTBIN long lists of Jerman personnel with their present or last known addresses were discovered in one of his notebooks.

- 44. On 26 February BRES had given a partial list of these experts. He admitted that he had had innumerable reports of the activities and whereabouts of Luftweffe scientists. He confirmed PETERSEN's information and added a few names and items. A more complete list will be issued as soon as BREE's notobooks have been discussed with him.

- 63. 38-Chergruppenführer (General) SCHWAB. ANRE claims not to know where he is now.
- stories recently about him. According to one he has disguised himself as an agricultural labourer and lives in Upper Bavaria. According to another he tried to become a monk in MITAL Monastery near OBERARMERGAU. (NOTE: BREE may know more than he has revealed. He was about to give us the address of KAMELTR's wife when he suddenly seemed to change his mind and declared that he could not remember. He had done the same on the preceding day with other names, stating that he had the addresses at BREMERHAVER and could send them to us. In fact he had all the addresses that he knows in several notebooks in a briefesse which he had by his side all through the two interrogetions.)
- Prof. von BRAUS. In reply to an enquiry BREE said 65. that Frof. von BRAUN was in the United States. (North: It is possible that BREE has not discovered that Prof. von BRAUN has been granted leave to come to Cermany to marry his former German secretary. Some of the experts in the United States, basing themselves on information obtained from reliable sources, are under the impression thet rof. von BRAUN has not yet revealed many of his major secrets, such as the latest projects submitted to his at KANNLER's "Arbeitsstab." BREE opined that von BRAUN knew of the concealment, in Spring 1945, of documents which related to his own field. For some time it has been felt that Frof. von BRAUN might use these mbeing documents so a strong bargaining point before signing a new contract with the Americans or that he might go so far as to negotiate a deal with the French or even the Eussians. To are planning to interview Prof. von BRAUN as soon as possible in the hope that, with his help, we shall find at least part of the missing documents.)
- Four Journeys. BREE had bound together in four volumes loose sheets containing notes on German specialists in V-2 and guided sissiles. The first is entitled:
 20-24 Sep 45, Journey to Hamburg, Lubrok, Traver Ndr.
 The second: 28 Sep-4 Cot 46, Journey to Lubrok, Kirl, ECKERSFORDE, Hamburg. The third: li-14 Cot 46, STAADE, BUXTEVHUDE, Harburg, Laurnburg, Domstorf, MELDECK, GREE, ILBERNAU, STADTHAGES, BECKEBURG, WESERSUNDE. The fourth:
 24 Oct-12 Nov 46, without mention of towns visited.
- Visited is listed, also all information obtained on other experts. The first volume alone contains more than 140 names. Opposite each name BREE states whether the specialist is now abroad, whether he has been approached by the British. U.S.. French or Russian authorities and whether he has accepted or rejected the offer. E.g. (20-24 Jep 46) WAHL. Landarbeiter ohne (working on a farm), meaning WAHL is now a farm labourer without (chne), i.e. without offer from any foreign power. (See para 58 for BREE's oral statements on WAHL.) WORLE Ing. Franc. meaning that WORLE is now an engineer in France. (See para 49.) SIEGERT, Landarbeiter ohne.

- the people listed in the four volumes. Another booklet gives the itineraries of more recent journeys.
- the lists and the purpose of establishing these lists. A separate report will be issued on his replies. This report should give us a fairly scourate picture of the present location and sotivities of German V-2 and guided missiles experts.
- obscure project of using Springbaustoffe (explosive construction material) as part of aircraft, rockets or guided missiles, i.e. the use of explosives with a dual purpose (a) as fuselage walls or as containers and (b) as explosives. BREE seemed to know little of this and could not tell what type of explosives were to be used for this double purpose, but he could indicate some of the scientists who probably know details of this German project.
- that BREE was an 33 general although his official position as head of 89 under Lt.Col. KNEMEYER, would preclude any higher rank than that of L.Col. One source stated that during the last few months of the war he had bypassed his chief KNEMEYER and had negotiated directly with General DIESIEG. BREE confirmed this on 27 seb 47.
- One other rusour had it that BREE, during the final phases of the war was actually an SS-Obergruppenfülrer (General) and Kammiah's superior. This has not been confirmed by BREE. He hedged when he was asked who signed the written order asking him to select suitable and essential specialists from all sections of ENEMFYER's Development Department in T.R.L. and to take all vital documents to BAD SACHSA. When pressed for names, he said first HIMMLER, leter SPEER, then he declared that he could not remember who signed this order. Under persistent questioning he finally stated that SB-General KAMMIER and General DIESTEG had signed this document. A letter found amongst his papers on the 27th February 1947 was addressed to him as "Lieber Herr BREE" and was followed by the remark that this address seemed so inadequate after that of General (which apparently had been used in previous etters.) If BREE sctually was a general he could have been that only in the 38, 1.e. 38-Obergruppenfährer or 38-Cruppenführer, and only towards the very end of the war. - DIESING and KAMMLER. Before BREE had been interviewed 73. by us it was surmised that General DIESING must have been. during the final months of the war, under the orders of KANNLER and that he collaborated with the SS. PETERSER had described fully the type of orders issued to him directly by DIESTEG concerning the hiding of the RECHLIE documents. PHTERSEN denied that DIESING had acted under orders of KAMMINER or of other 85 generals. BREE, however. finally confirmed that DIESING was constantly in touch with KAMMLER during the last phase of the war, that on KAMMLER's orders a large part of DIESING's T.L.R. was trensferred to the HARE Mountains and that KANNLER and DIESING jointly migned the document appointing BREE chief of T.L.R. Development and removing key personnel and documents to the HARE.
- 74. OCHCLUBIONS. The investigation has only begun and it is too early to draw definite conclusions. However, it is safe to say that PETERSEN and BREE have been playing a double game. Not all their activities have been in the interests of or is collaboration with the United States and Britain. It is reasonably certain that BREE has hidden and not yet surrendered to U.S. or British authorities some of the most valuable German war documents, especially those dealing with the latest V-2 and guided missiles projects, approved or rejected by Prof. von BRAUN and BREE at BAD SACHSA in Spring 1945.
- 75. The investigation should establish the present address and activities of most German V-2 and guided missiles experts. The fate of the relevant documents is still uncertain. Some were surrendered to U.S. and British sutherities but what percentage has not yet been sucertained. A large consignment has reached the French recently. Further lots may have been found by BREE within the last few weeks.
- 76. PETERSEN's documents should cover all tests, under battle conditions, of Luftwaffe weapons and aircraft. BREE's and KNEMEYER's should include all data of the Development Department of T.L.R. (BIRSING's) on Luftwaffe weapons and aircraft, including guided missiles, and of the "Arbeitsstab KAMMLER" in March and April 1945 on V-2 and guided missiles as well as some other weapons.
- 77. To speed up the recovery of documents hidden at WESERN NDE and apparently retrieved by BREE, it may be advisable to secore Dipl. Ing. Emil SINGERT at INMENSEE bei LEHRYE Br. 60. He may explain the meaning of "etwas..... was ich inzwischen ans Land gezogen habe." He may also know what other documents were hidden which now "slumber in archives to which none of us can gain access." (BREE's letter to SINGERT.)
- 78. Prof. von BRAUN will be interviewed in a few days and may shed light on the BAD SACHSA documents of "Arbeitsstab KAMMLER." These should prove the most valuable as many projects, though deemed useful in themselves, were rejected or postponed merely because in Spring 1945 the Germans lacked laboratries, staff and factories to develop them. This is all the more reason for not accepting as true BREE's statement that all this valuable material was burned. In fact, originally he admitted taking only "correspondence" to BAD SACHSA, not date on projects and development.

- of value. There has been no time to examine it closely. It appears to be BRER's evaluation of a project dealing with guided missiles, possibly written at BAD SACHSA. It may be the "etwes" (something) which he sent to SIEGERT (para 77) after fishing it cut of the water at WESERW NDE or finding it at BAD SACHSA in January or February 1947.
- notes on all his sovements and all his recent journeys. His notes are so copious that it will take weeks of hard work to complete their transcription. Photostat copies will be made immediately for a restricted distribution prior to a more complete report.
- In all details. Most of the paragraphs were written without the aid of documents. The SORG-PETERSEN case has so rapidly developed into a major case involving the latest activities in V-2 and guided missiles that facts and figures could only be assembled haphagardly.
