I refer to Robin Brook's Ms/10/155 of the 3rd April, with attached correspondence.

This no doubt arises from our request to M.I.5 for facilities to obtain personal information about leading members of the R.S.H.A. on which I wrote to CD/O on the 16th March. (ACD/79/7268). You directed that back to me with the word "Yes".

(I attach a copy of ACD/79/7268 for your convenient reference.)

The argument for FOXLEY and FOXLEY II was basically the disorganisation that these operations, if successful, would have caused in the O.I.S.

As the O.I.S. had probably been fairly well disorganised since by other events, I think the balance of advantage would not lie in trying to catch R.S.H.A. officials of the Kaltenrunner type, alive.

I may say in passing that I think the argument in the third paragraph of Robertson's letter is not quite sound, as there might well be circumstances in which assassination was possible, but arrest was not possible.

However, I advise that we give the necessary reassurance and I suggest for your consideration your reply to Robin Brook on the following lines:

"I refer to your Ms/10/155 of the 3rd April, with attached correspondence. The FOXLEY operations were considered at a time when it was thought that a certain thinning of the ranks

I have been asked by I.I.B whether we have ever cleared on a War Cabinet or high level, Operation FOXLEY II, which applies to the proposed assassination of senior Nazi officials.

We got high authority for Operation FOXLEY but there was some doubt as to its wisdom in some places and it may be that the greater includes the lesser.

It will suffice I think, if I inform I.I.B that we have generally, authority to proceed on FOXLEY lines and approval of the major FOXLEY operation obviously includes the lesser.

FOKLEY II.

1. In XP/10/24, it was suggested that FOKLEY II be extended to include BOHMANN, GOEBBELS, GOERING, KALTENBRUNNER and any others whose names I might care to submit.

2. In addition to the above persons I would suggest that certain less prominent lights of the SS hierarchy - potentially more dangerous on account of their comparative youth and the active part they might well play in any Nazi underground movement - be included.

3. These persons are in all cases high ranking SS officers in charge of various Hauptämter of the SS or of departments in the Reichssicherheitshauptamt (RSHA). With one or two exceptions they are still, it is believed, all located in Berlin or its suburbs, and offer a considerably easier target than HITLER, HIMMLER or GOEBBELS for example.

4. The relationship of the various SS-Hauptämter, the RSHA, and the Ordnungspolizei with the Allgemeine SS, the Waffen SS and the police is shown diagrammatically in Appendix I.

5. The names of the above key-men and the offices they hold are given in Appendix II. Apart from future considerations, the elimination of some of the above would probably have an immediate and marked effect on Party morale.

6. Photographs and/or descriptions of certain of these persons are already in our possession, and it is hoped shortly to complete the list together with any changes in address (office and residential), as well as to obtain information on the daily routine, habits, etc., of these persons.

7. In view of the apparent tardiness in withdrawing FM from West Prussia it is possible that SS and RSH offices may remain in Berlin and only be withdrawn to South Germany at the last moment, although there is already evidence that archives were removed some time ago.
