

A. SUMMARY

1) The Inter-service communications centre which by the end of February had moved from ZOSSEN to a location in THURINGIA has now vacated THURINGIA and shared out its tasks between ZOSSEN and a communications centre in the SALZBURG area.

Whilst in THURINGIA it served a large number of senior staff departments belonging to all arms of the services except the Navy.

- 2) The area WEIMAR-GOTHA became during early March the rallying point of OKH. Further,
 - G.A.F., which in early March seemed to be migrating towards KURFUERST 3 at WASSERBURG in BAVARIA, meantime put into the WEIMAR area

3) First candidates for positions in THURINGIA (particularly

in WEIMAR, GOTHA) were OKH departments. But OKH seems, in the light of most recent evidence since February to have had skeleton staffs at each of the following:-

OKH/Echelon A: "Zeppelin" at ZOSSEN, Echelon C: "OLGA" and "GUNTHER" at OHRDRUF and GOTHA respectively, Echelon B: "CAESAR" in the SALZBURG area at ?

4) If the communications centre which, whilst in THURINGIA, served Echelon C has now shared out its tasks between ZOSSEN and a centre in the SALZBURG area, it seems that Echelon B may increase in importance and be the next rallying point.

5) OKM as recently as 26/3 ... moved its 'Y' Service to NEUMUENSTER (between HAMBURG and KIEL): it had previously moved other war staffs to WILHELMSHAFEN. There are, however, since 28/3, indications of a major transfer.

II. Inter-Service communications.

There is little to add to the particulars given in the opening Summary, under I. The communications centre in THURINGIA from 31/3 handed over various lines to a centre believed to be in the area N.W. of SALZBURG; these were by April 2nd identifiable as:-

G.H.Q. Linos to: COPENHAGEN and AARHUS OSLO (C. in C. WEST ?) (Army Group G ?) 19 Army Army Group E RHODES

The romaining C a in C. and Army Groups are being served by ZOSSEN.

III. Oborkommando dos Hooros

From the end of February to the end of March OKH had cloarly throo separate Echolons, A, B, and C, at T501/18,19 ZOSSEN, at an unidentified location in the SALZBURG 25 Rof. 953 aroa, and at OHRDRUF in THURINGIA respectively. The authorities identified by source at each oithor stated, in so many words, that they word at "ZEPPELIN" (ZÓSSEN) oto., or addod "Moholon A" oto. to their title, or, thirdly, betrayed their location by the use of compromised telographic addrossos: HZPH (ZOSSEN) HOLG (OLGA), HOUX (GUNTHER), HDVO (Trunk Exchange 'ALPEN', bolievod to bo in the SALZBURG area). The relationship between Echolons A and C during the past month is perhaps indicated by the arrange- T. 491/42 monts made by Director of Army Signals and by QMG. T. 499/53 Abt. (Roman) I, on 8/3 and 20/3 respectively: "Only matters of fundamental importance" to ZOSSEN (Boholon A), all routino matters to "GUNTHER via OLGA" (GOTHA via OIRDRUF), which is known to have been Behelon C. How Boholon B (cover-name "CAESAR") stood in rolation to A and C was not clarified: An Austrian staff officer deserter who left the Fuchrerhauptquartier about 21 March stated "not GAD/PK 426 OBERSALZBURG but OHRDRUF in THURINGIA 18 altornativo H. Q. " STOP PRISS: OHRDRUF as alternative H. Q. for O. in O. WEST. T.507/35

NOTE: Officer deserter armed with an OLSU/VM 123 original document of Chef HNV equates cover-name CLGA with OIRDRUF (WJ 15). (See above further evidence indicating the importance of OHRDRUF). Same source gives GUNTHER as cover name of GOTHA. GUNTHER was probably, more exactly, the T.505/124 cover name of "OKH Communications Station, BORG Barracks, GOTHA" which source first reported on 31/3.

VI. Ciphers and Cryptography

OKW/Ciphers (which we had but recently located in the HINDENBURG Barracks in DRESDEN) S.160 seems to have moved to HALLE. An officer T.506/26 deserter, considered particularly reliable, states that OKH Cryptography has also moved to HALLE. There is no news of OKW Cryptography for whose personnel a survey was to be conducted in the WEIMAR area. S.160

VII. Abwehr and RSHA

Scrutiny of Abwehr (now 'Militacrisches Amt') documents shows, by 29/3, the following moves from the BERLIN area:

Personnel Section: HOF, BAVARIA Lehrregi ent KURFUERST: TRIPTIS, THURINGIA Equipment Centre for Field Units: STAFFELSTEIN near BAMBERG Communications H.Q.: EISENBERG, near JENA Section D (sabotage, etc.).ADORF, VOGTLAND Control I, East: BAD ELSTER, near ADORF

RSHA AMT VI (Security Service) Communications H.Q.: Adv. Det. BURGLENGENFELD, North of REGENSBURG.

VIII. <u>Miscellaneous</u>

21/3 German Ministry of Railways (war transport section) had four representatives in the ERFURT area to only one in ZOSSEN. $R_{\bullet}506(A)57$
