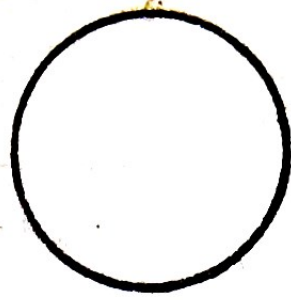

RUMOUR OF WORK ON ROCKET WEAPONS.

"In the meantime some gentlemen from the KPD came to me with some more or less discreet proposals, that I should continue working on rocket-weapons for the RUSSIANS. Although I would have immediately acquiesced for the AMERICANS, the matter requires some real deliberation when it concerns the RUSSIANS.

According to latest news, the RUSSIANS are firing zealously into the OSTSEE. Anyhow not from PEENEMUENDE, for everything has been dismantled over there."
