

	Comment: Krenz undoubtedly engineered the cabinet's resignation, a move that leaves his position as head of state intact. He probably will appoint more non-Communist ministers from members of the four allied parties to try to appear responsive to demands that the Communists share power. Currently there is only one member from each. It is possible, although less likely, that he will appoint a non-Communist as premier. The legislative committee's rejection of the proposed travel reforms suggests that the normally rubberstamp		
	krenz will have to move fast to maintain control over a rapidly changing situation. At the party plenum, which is likely to be contentious, he probably will try to purge more hardliners beyond the seven already removed to consolidate his hold on the leadership.		6.2
