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The Ambassador inquired where the new line would Stalin replied that he was not sure of the details, run. but that he believed it would run roughly through Shanghai, the Ghantung peninsula, Manchuria and around the Interest islands. He stated with the that the Japanese would not engage their main forces to defend the outer perimeter of their defenses but would withdraw to inner lines which were more convenient and easier to defend.
