Summary:

The two leaders signed off on a "minute of understanding" expressing their understanding on the MLF, replacement of Jupiters with Polaris by April 1, the substitution of Sergeant for Corporal missiles, and the possibility of using the Jupiters for "space experiments." In accordance with Fanfani's request, the minute was retyped to leave out the reference to bases in the Mediterranean.

MINUTE OF UNDERSTANDING

The following minute embodies the understanding reached by President Kennedy and Prime Minister Fanfani on Thursday, January 17, 1963:

- 1. The President and the Prime Minister have agreed on the importance of establishing a multilateral NATO nuclear force. It is their belief that Italy should participate in this force and that in particular Italy should be a member of the NATO committee which it is expected will be formed for developing the plans for such a force and for managing its direction when established.
- 2. In anticipation of this multilateral defense force, the United States will make available Polaris submarines to insure modernized nuclear defense of the Mediterranean area of the alliance. These Polaris submarines will be on station by April 1.
- 3. In the light of these arrangements, Prime Minister Fanfani will propose to his Government that the present Jupiter missile bases in Italy be eliminated by April 1.
- 4. The President in turn agreed to the replacement of existing Corporal missiles by Sergeant missiles.
- 5. Italian technical personnel and specially trained troops presently working at missile bases in Italy will share in setting up new facilities for Sergeant missiles.
- 6. To the extent that it is practicable, Jupiter missiles will be used for peaceful space experiments wherever this can be most effectively done.
