SUBJECT: RFB Guidance, October 24, 1956, for Bungarian Developments

- 1. Heavy and detailed coverage of Hungarian developments should be played extensively to all targets. These news reports should take priority over all other breadcasts.
- 2. A parallel may be drawn between the popular Founda uprising and the participation of the mon-Communist individuals in the oprising in Endapost.
- 3. Hungarian developments demonstrate the irresistable desire for real freedom and an expression by the people to move for action to satisfy that desire.
- 4. The use of Sevist troops should be treated as a crime and an outrageout indigative to the people of Rungary. It should be pointed out that if the demands of the people of Rungary were not, there would be no need for trees action, either Seviet or Rungarian.
- 5. Do no prejudge the action of Magy and Gamilla. He must know more about their actual policies.
- 6. Despite the foregother, Maio is emblement to indicate that the May Government will have to live down calling in Seviet troops to rectore order. This deed can be lived down only by begging premises to the people for establishing a climate of real freedom and material satisfaction for which the people years.
- 7. Quete extensively from the Risenbower message of September 2), using particularly, "A people which has once known freedom cannot be deprived for always of its national independence and its personal liberty. This truth applies to all people in Emstern Europe. Leve of freedom is more enduring than the power of tyrants".
