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

- 5. A significant decrease in the jouring of Newtons broadcasts, including RFS into Poland, which is assumed to reflect official Polish policy. For the time being, therefore, until the secree of events in the Satallitee may be more showly understood, the following guideness for FEC is not forth below:

<u>General</u>:

We should be guided by an objective of branking up or vectoring what has been up to now the momentation unity within the Seviet Assistanted power bloc of Sestern Europe.

We should continue to carefully encourage graintinging changes toward descountiation and salf-determination, while at the same time evolding steps which might provide Seviet representant in other Satellites. We do not went to incite violent servet in Poland or in any other Satellite (and particularly not in East Germany, where the Seviets plan to remain at any cost).

Full coverage should be given to the efforts of the West to seriet the Hungarian people, including action in the United Hatisans; efforts by the West in furnishing medical, food, clathing and other essistance; assistance to Hungarian refugees in the West; sottivities of recent Hungarian refugees in mobilizing public opinion and ether activities for carrying on the fight for the freedom of the Hungarian people from the West; Western reaction to the events in Hungary; the defections from the Communist parties in the West; all statements by international figures and organizations condemnatory of Soviet repression in Emgany (the Colombo Powers Statement, for energie,

calling for Soviet troop withdrawal); and the like: Exeminate to Soviet troops should be continued.

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- 3. Notesial assistance to refugees should continue through FESS in sooperation with other relief and values aganting.
- 9. Plane should be developed to exploit fully in the Free North the reversion to Stalinian and the nated colonialism of the Pevist Union in Engary via all PEC secets, including PEES, PEP and NYS.
