: March 15 Hungarian Independence Day


1. March 15 is Hungarian Independence Day the anniversary of the famous poem of Sandor Petoefi written in 1848 when the Hungarians under Kossuth won independence from Austria. The Kadar regime is taking extraordinary measures to ensure that no major uprising takes place in Hungary on this date. It is rumored that 12,000 anti-regime youths may be arrested for a period of a month to curtail possible unrest. We do not anticipate that there will be another revolution in Hungary starting on March 15. There will be large demonstrations permitted by the regime and it is possible that some of these may get out of hand and that there may be some shooting and loss of life.

2. Our guidence from the Department of State calls for extreme care by all media directed to Hungary. We are asked to play down March 15 saying nothing which would in any way give the impression that the West may directly or indirectly give support to armed uprising. On the other hand our media should not appear to give advice asking the people to avoid bloodshed or suggesting that they not engage in anti-regime <u>demonstrations</u>.

Poles have very little to lose.
