The Commister approved the RFE and USIA papers before them consistsing Gamehomic walks. Hangary, Poland, and Remarks, with the understanding that it will be the usual rule that VCA will not broadcast communitary originated by it on the internal affairs of the countries to which RFE broadcasts. When, under unique circumstances, an exception to this general rule is deemed appropriate, VCA will broadcast communitary on internal actions only on the basis of officially setherized policy guidances. Copies of the papers will now be sent to Messre. Arthur Israen, Allen Dulles and Robert Hurphy as was done with the papers on Bulgaria. Copies will also be sent to the Count. General in Humish, and as appropriate to the participants in the Schrewe Conference.

It was noted that the Bulgarian paper would have to be medified with respect to the language on specific guidances to bring it in line with the papers just approved.

Hr. Herry stated that, after consideration within (Bit, it had been decided they could and would raise the classification of their policy papers to Secret.

It was agreed that the annuous would be completed and added to the policy papers. Although the annuous have not been considered by the Consisting they will be considered as part of the approved papers, enhance to any objections that might be relead on a post-mindit busis.
