I. Mr. Maraddan reported that because of budget difficulties SUR evidently will be unable to finance the travel of a participant in the Schweims Conference from Belgesia. He noted that because of the death of the Sceneeler, the officer designated to attend from Selgrade probably in fact would be unable to attend in any once and since it had been SUR rather than the Consistent that been most interested in Sulgrade participation he mented to confirm his secondition that the Consistent would not chieve the dropping Belgrade participation. There was no objection. He reported also that HE has mend no political officer to attends. Although a final decision hes not been taken, it appears for budgetaxy response no one will attend.

Hr. Boscner stated that, although the maker of USIA perticipants would not be improved, there would be cortain changes in persons designated to participate in the Conference.

Mr. Con reported that a technician familiar with jamming problems from Mr. Hordback's organization will be available on the final day of the Conference to ensure any questions that night come up in the course of the Conference.

II. Hr. Remany reported that agreement had been reached by the working groups on the RFE papers, but that on the WA papers there use disagreement with respect to the addition of the plurase "on a case by case basis" to the sentence "then specifically authorized by official pridences /fin a case by case basis? WA may discuss inversable developments within the Soviet Orbit and outline tattractive alternatives? which might be attainable under catching conditions in "tr. The Consistent approved the RFE and USIA papers before them conserving Genehomic value. Hungary, Foland, and Romania, with the understanding that it will be the usual rule that VCA will not broadcast communicary originated by it on the internal affairs of the countries to which RFE broadcasts. When, under unique circumstances, an exception to this general rule is deemed appropriate, VCA will broadcast connectary on internal matters only on the basis of officially mathemined pelloy guideness. Copies of the papers will now be sent to Memory. Arthur Larson, Allan Dulles and Robert Harphy as was dure with the paper on Bulgaria. Copies will also be such to the Consul demoval in Manish, and as appropriate to the participants in the Schreme Conferences.

It was noted that the Bulgarian paper would have to be medified with respect to the language on specific guidances to bring it in line with the papers just approved.

Hr. Hever stated that, after consideration within (Bik, it had been decided they could and would raise the classification of their policy papers to Secret.

It was agreed that the annumer would be completed and added to the pelicy papers. Although the annumer have not been considered by the Consister, they will be considered as part of the approved papers, subject to any objections that might be reised on a pert-audit bunks.
