Summary:

An official from the Department of State, the Office of Policy Coordination updates Frank Wisner on possibilities for providing the Free Europe Committee (FEC) with intelligence reports for use in planned Radio Free Europe broadcasts. He also suggests that Foreign Broadcast Information Bureau monitoring reports of Soviet bloc media can be provided, but only in English translations.

- I. I have talked so far to Ted Babbitt, ADER and head of FRIB, both are envious to help. I agreed that any direct negotiations we would have with the HBC would be made jointly with him or his representative, but pointed out that it was highly unlikely we would have any much direct dealings as we would prefer to use the Foreign Office as the out-out in such instances. I quested him shether he thought that any declarationalisation requirement presented itself in that parties of the FRIS take in which HGFS is interested. He said, no. Gertain FRIS natural is classified restricted for copyright reasons only, he explained, but Satellite and Soviet propagands would not be considered in such a sensitive category.
