Quidance to Radio Liberation from New York on Satellite Situation.

1. The attached Telecon conversation between New York and Munich giving guidance for treatment of the satellite situation was given me by telephone by Rob Dreher. Breher explained that a meeting had been held in Andomidb before the Telecon to arrive at a position, at which the guidance sent by this branch earlier in the morning had been read. The refusal of permission for Humich to broadcast any commentary stems directly from Mr. Sargeant, magnified by Mr. Shub. Mr. Dunham did not dissent.

2. Mr. Sargeant's reasoning, as transmitted by Mr. Breher, is that the situation is so fluid and so risky that Hadio Idberation must not get into an editorial position at this time. He feels that it is essential to avoid giving the listeners an impression of outside interference and that HadLib is so identified as an Ameridan voice that its comment could be considered interference. Furthermore, Mr. Sargeant 1s convinced that through the manipulation of news RadLib can establish its position just as well or better than by delivering editorials.

3. The question of distinction between VOA and Radiab was reised, and it was pointed out that Radiab is not quoting western comment to any extent, and no U.S. comment, whereas VOA's job is to give U.S. reaction.

4. I find myself in complete disagreement with the ban on communtary. But I do not feel that I can oppose the Sargeant-Shub-Dunham position with my own opinion, or even that I should. May we discuss?
