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APPROVAL OF MINUTES

2.1 Ministerial Meeting held on 4.6.1975

The meeting noted a statement by the Chairman that the minutes of the Ministerial meeting held in Israel with on 4.6.1975 have been returned to Israel after perusal by Minister P W Botha.

Certain minor connections in language only were suggested.

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3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

3.1 FINANCIAL MATTERS

3.1.1 Financial Agreement

The meeting <u>noted</u> a statement by the Chairman that a draft Financial Agreement had been prepared.

(Copies were made available to the Israeli representatives for study).

It was <u>agreed</u> that the matter be discussed further on Tuesday, 1st July 1975.

It was <u>further agreed</u> that Lt Gen Pienaar attend discussions in this regard.

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3.3 : Terms of Reference

The meeting <u>noted</u> a statement by the Chairman that certain minor alterations have been suggested.

The suggestions are contained in the paper before the Committee.

It was agreed that the matter be discussed further on Tuesday, 1 July 1975.

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3.4.2. : L.R.B.M. (ulrealy talking about it)

It was agreed that this matter stand over for discussion on Thursday, 3 July 1975.

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The meeting further noted -

- (i) that paragraph 10 was <u>not</u> clear to Israeli representatives, whereupon it was <u>agreed</u> that the matter be further discussed on Thursday, 3 July 1975, in order to await developments with regard to the Minister's letter;
- (ii) an explanation by Mr Shapiro, with regard to paragraph 13, that Cane is contemplating to embark on a very ambitious programme and that a proposal has been made to the RSA to participate, whereupon it was agreed to discuss the matter further on Thursday, 3 July 1975, when Armscor matters receive attention.

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RULES OF PROCEDURE

ANNEXURE B

In order to maintain control and co-ordination over all activities approved by ISSA, the following procedure will be established and adhered to:

1. Authorisation of new subjects

Requests originating from R.S.A. will be channeled through the Head of Technical Mission, Armaments Board to Defence Sales Office in the M.O.D. for approval, dissemination and action.

2. Purchases in Israel

Request by A.B. to purchase from Israeli Defence Industries, after being approved by M.O.D. will be transmitted to the Industries, with authorization to negotiate. The A.B. will be notified of such authorization for negotiations and execution may then commence by A.B. or other body (e.g. NIDR or Armscor or an Armscor subsiduary).

3. Financial consideration

All financial aspects will be governed by any existing umbrella agreement between A.B. and M.O.D. DEFENCE INTELLIG

4. Purchases from other sources

Requests by A.B. for purchases from other sources (non Israeli) will be processed directly by the M.O.D./Defehc SMIT Sales Office in response to A.B. specific request.

Documentation

Copies of orders or contracts will be forwarded to

6. Communication channels

All communications will be channeled through or with a copy to M.O.D. mission, Pretoria.

7. Approving and Co-ordinating visits to Israel

Requests for visits on new or unapproved subjects from R.S.A. to the Defence Establishment or Industries will be made to Defence Sales Office, for authorisation and co-ordination as applicable. (Excluding purely military visits which will be processed through the military channels.)

Visits on approved subjects will be negotiated direct with copy to Defence Sales for co-ordination and assistance as may be necessary (e.g. where I.D.F. may be involved).

8. Security arrangements

All activities between the R.S.A. and Israel Defence Establishments and Industries are automatically covered by the SECMENT Agreement.

Note: The term "purchase" implies all activities which might result in a Contractual undertaking.

All communication to M.O.D. will be channeled through M.O.D. mission for dissemination.

DISCUSSIONS IN CONNECTION WITH JAPONICA PROJECT

SUBJECT

1. Establishment of A.B. team in CANE.

Minister of Defence ISRAEL will represent A.B. for purposes of erection of the required building at ISL.

Minister of Defence will actually sign the agreement which will have been negotiated in full by A.B.

A back to back agreement will be entered into between A.B. and to quarantee M.O.D's committment.

Mr Ironi confirm that such an arrangement will apply to all such type of contracts. He confirmed that M.O.D. will firstly endeavour to arrange for IAI to fulfill this function if they do not find it possible M.O.D. will assist.

Col. Marais mentioned the question of personal accommodation.

It is confirmed that no assistance is required from M.O.D in this connection.

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The S.A. Consulates legal advisor has agreed to lassing 2006

the negotiations and IAI have agreed to serve as quarantor A.B. will furnish a back up quarantee to IAI.

Mr P Smith will arrange a sentable back to back agreement with M.O.D. to cover their undertakings on A.B.'s behalf.

Adm. Biermann

The Admiral reaffirm that the same problem of legal status applies to the SAN team which is being established in Israel.

Mr Ironi confirms that the same arrangement as is offered for the A.B. team will be available for the SAN team.

Mr Smith proposes retaining the services of the legal advisor by means of an honorarim.

It is agreed that A.B. will retain the services of the legal advisor for the use of both parties. However the A.B. and SAN representatives will initiate and negotiate the various agreements.

Mr Smith will discuss this matter with Comptologrence INTELIGED PAdm Biermann informed.

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Admiral Biermann requests M.O.D. advice whether it may be advisable to erect a school for the S.A. personel. 68484963PE WO1

M.O.D. Mr Ironi approves of the idea and confirmed that there

Admiral Biermann raises the question about income tax for private individuals. Mr Ironi confirms that if necessary he would personally take up the matter with that treasury.

Mr Ironi suggest issuing diplomatic passports.

A.B. confirm that the men would not be allowed diplomatic passports.

Consideration would be given to the status of the official pass=

Gen Lemmer confirm that official passports are not issued because of security reasons.

He undertakes to investigate the possibility of issuing official passports.

Mr Ironi undertakes to investigate the matter of passports in Israel.

Gen Lemmer will liaise with the Israel officials on his next visit.

In reply to a question of transfer of goods Gen Lemmer informs the meeting that CSI will undertake all transfer to Israel.

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2) Use of Local consultants

It is agreed that the covering factor is the security aspect.

where M = Percent material of contract price.

L = Percent labour of contract price.

Wi = Weighted average of official published indi= ces for labour in Israel applicable to each contract.

Wo = Official index for labour on date of offer. of contract price.

Ro = Rate of Exchange (Selling) between the U.S.A. dollar and Israeli pound ruling on date of offer.

Ri = Rate of Exchange (Selling) between the U.S.A. dollar and Israeli pound on date of payment by the Board against any contract.

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
MOD 6 : NEW TANK - MINUTES OF 3rd ISSA MEETING

Visit by Technical Team to Cane completed beginning September 1975. Team established feasibility and extent of local manufacture based on existing infra structure.

MOD cannot make tank as a weapons system available for evaluation by the SADF/AB for another 12 months and insists that a contract or heads of agreement be entered into before such an evaluation be conducted.

The S A Army is insisting on the ruling at 3rd Issa Meeting viz. that prior to a contract being entered into the tank be evaluated as a weapons system.

Therefore, whilst the S A Army finds the Feast tank acceptable in principle, in terms of the agreement reached at the 3rd ISSA Meeting, the conclusion of a licence and know-how agreement will depend on the successful verification of the tank performance and the negotiation of mutually acceptable terms and conditions.

The tenders are under evaluation and orders will be placed during November 1975.

All arrangements are in hand for establishing a South African school on the outskirts of Haifa.

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IAI 12 : COMMAND AND CONTROL SYSTEM FOR SHIPS - MINUTES OF 3rd ISSA MEETING (Par. 3.7.4.)

A presentation was made by IAI which was well received by SAN, SAAF and AB members. The final decision on co-operation and time scale will depend entirely on the allocation of funds on a priority basis. No provision is presently made for such a program up till 1977/78.

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
