Our previous informants about the negotiations between Israel and the Argentine for the purchase of uranium have taken a second look at the sources of the report as a result of hearing the reaction from Washington. They now conclude that they are very doubtful about the reliability of the report. At least it paid us a small dividend in producing the information from Buenos Aires.
