Summary:

In response to a request for further instructions, the Dept. of State informed the Embassy that Washington was looking to establish a common policy on the mandatory application of IAEA safeguards. Until they were closer to agreement, the Embassy should request that the Argentine government apply safeguards to future deals.

A formal approach requesting Argentina's participation in this common policy will be made at the appropriate time. The conclusion of a formal agreement among the suppliers is still some time in the future. Even before a common policy is adopted, it is hoped that Argentina will adopt a policy of requiring safeguards on nuclear materials sold to other countries.
