This course of action was, in fact, suggested by the GOI early this year in response to a question by a visiting American official about the sale of Argentine uranium to Israel as reported in 1 April 1964 issue of Nachrichten fur Aussenhandel. However, in view of the reservations expressed in Buenos Aires' 749 to the Department (November 30), we have never mentioned the subject. If the Department decides that a direct inquiry should be ide, we would appreciate specific instructions.
