Dear Mr. Narasimhan.

President Park laid down this week the blue print of his administration's policies for 1971. In a budgetary message addressed to the National Assembly on 2 September 1970, he outlined the major guidelines for the course of his country's future development. An analysis of this message suggests that the main emphasis would be on the acceleration of the economic development of the Republic of Korea and the creation of a new defence industry. The budget bill sent to the National Assembly was scaled at \$\mathscr{9}28,246\$ million (about US\$1,704 million). The defence expenditure was set at \$\mathscr{9}127,810\$ (about US\$412.3 million), or roughly 24.02 per cent of the total Government budget. The budgetary message also stressed an annual economic growth of 10 per cent for 1971 during which a firm foundation would be laid for the start of the third five-year economic plan.

Touching on other issues, the President reiterated in his message that he is opposed to the US troops reduction in the Republic of Korea in view of the fact that a US military disengagement here could affect the total security of East Asia. On the other hand, it was reliably stated that the US Government went ahead with its troops withdrawal plan despite the continued objection of the Republic of Korea Government and pulled out during the last few months around 10,000 US soldiers, and it is hoping to withdraw another 10,000 by the end of next June.

The President took this issue again this week with the US Army Chief of Staff, General William C. Westmoreland, and requested that there should be no further reduction in the number of US troops here, but was made to understand that there could be no official US assurance in this regard.
