Dear Mr. Narasimhan,

The forthcoming session of UNCURK is scheduled to be held on 5 and 6 November 1970 in Kawama, Japan, under the chairmanship of Ambassador Chote Klongvicha, Representative of Thailand. The Representative of Chile, Ambassador Augusto Marambio, informed me today that he would be unable to attend the session. It is my understanding that, with the pending change of the administration in Chile following the results of the last election, the present Chilean Government could not decide on asking its representative to attend the session. At any rate, the Commission is bound to take up this question at a later stage.

In addition to its discussion of the general situation in the Republic of Korea, the Commission is expected to provide the Secretary-General with a confidential letter outlining its views and assessment of the situation in Korea since the submission of UNCURK's last report to him on 13 August 1970. The letter, which will be signed by the Chairman of the Commission, would endeavour to keep the Secretary-General informed of developments here thus avoiding the submission of another report before the debate in the First Committee on the Korean question. I shall forward this letter to you once its contents are discussed and approved by the Commission.
