ROK TROOP WITHDRAWAL FROM VIET-NAM

Dear Mr. Narasimhan,

The ROK Government announcement of 6 November 1971, concerning the decision to withdraw 10,000 Korean troops between 1 December 1971 and 31 June 1972 and subsequent full withdrawal, created mixed feelings in the Press.

The over-all reaction favours the original 1965 decision to despatch the troops; praises the contribution of Korean soldiers to an invaded friend; welcomes generally the decision to withdraw; and expresses anxiety for the substantial economic loss that would be inevitably incurred as a result of full withdrawal.

My impression is that full withdrawal might be expedited primarily in connexion with the impact of the PRC's entry into the United Nations.
