Your Excellency:

As you all know, the Central Liaison Office of our Asian Peoples' Anti-Communist League is just beginning its operations. This is a orusially important time in the fight against Communism, and we must implement the activities of the League quickly and with maximum effectiveness.

We hope, therefore, that you will be able to send one member of your delegation to Korea to work with the Central Liaison Office in the furtherance of our common objectives. All of us need the sage counsel and help of all the others, and such central cooperation is the only way to achieve that objective at this time.

If we can gather momentum now, we shall be able to evaluate the position of our mortal enemy, International Communism, and take the necessary steps to assure its defeat. Quick action is of the essence. The Central Liaison Office must be made an efficient, going concern just as soon as possible, and that will require the assistance of all of you.

We shall greatly appreciate your views upon this urgent matter, and hope that you will be able to send a representative to the Central Liaison Office within the next few weeks.
