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# DRAFT RESOLUTION SUBMITTED BY THE CHIMPSE DELECATION JUNE 16, 1954

It was from the meetings of President Chiene Kal dick of the Republic of Chiene and President Syngman Rice of the Republic of Korea a conference has given high in Chiene, Korea, on June 15, 1954 in which the peoples! representatives from Chiene, thoroug Victory, the Philippines, The Land, Rynkyn, Kong Kong and Peace attended.

The conference is: The Man Peoples! Anti-Consumist Conference. It lested for those days in which patlems of telels anti-consumist flavor have been forcely discussed with outbusiness and condicitive.

- 1. We believe As a has only one arch energy. It is communist Deperialism. As a is not only the major battlefield of the aggressors at the present time, but will also be the decisive front between the aggressor and anti-aggression camps. Should Soviet Bush a be able to conquer As a, peace and security of the entire world would be lost.

We hope that the Asign and the Pacific nations must hasten to set up an organization for collective security, but we sincerely believe that any organization forcellective security without the participation of the determinedly anti-communist nations with effective strength will produce \*\*\* practical results.

We believe that, in speaking of time, the arti-communist task bould start night now and in speaking of place, it should start from cities to villages, from labor unions to rural organizations, from schools to churches, from householders to government offices and from nations to all the nations of the world, anti-communist works should be conipresent.
