Dear Friends from freedom-loving countries in (sic.




I understand that this great conference aims at an organized and effective body of anti-Communist youths and students in Asia, deriving its principle and spirit from the Chinhae Conference attended by President Chiang Kai-shek of the Republic of China and President Syngman Rhee of the Republic of Korea in August of 1949, and two subsequent Asian Peoples' Anti-Communist Conference in June of 1954 and in March of 1956. The world situation we are now facing is very serious; indeed this is the very situation in which ferocious Communists are menacing international peace and security, while those who are not waked up from the illusion of coexistence are still # trying to appease the Communists. Now is the time every youth and student in Asia should become aware of that real strength of free world lies in unity, and that there can be no enduring peac for any nation while other nations suffer oppression and threat by diabolic forces of Communists. I trost that our common goal can eventually be realized by your tireless efforts and that this conference will set up an indelible landmark in our vigorous march toward anti-Comminism and international peace, as well as welfare of mankind.
