This country is very proud of having taken both the initiatives to open the First Conference of AFACI in Chinhai two years are, and again the remorable conference of today.

We welcome from our heart all of you the came from our members states. To believe that your coming to this country withit have some great meaning, because this is the lind hours the glory of democracy was saved, the land where the barbarism and atrosity of communism has been mostly raied for the first time in world's history. The world over was crashed obtilessly by the combined will of the army of cichteer countries of United Nations.

To be realised into a concrete action with a cortain success. Fore than one hundred thousand soldiers of United Untions have siven their slorious heath for the cause of democracy. Tremendous amount of war materials were spent. Howevever the final purpose of unification of this country has not been won. It seems that such noble mission of attaining national freedom cannot be accomplished without the holy sacrifice of the people who desires to have it.

However, we young generations are to-day facing with a great danger of materialism and easy life. European manner of life with its philosophy of materialism has been penetrating into the heart of our people's life and into every corner of our home. Light music through radio and love-scene of cinema are incessantly making us to forget our great dream of the great cause that is the unification of this country, and the same condition with Viet-Nam, and the regaining back of Chinese main continent in the case of Free China. Big dinners and fine dresses are nothing to do with the life of a revolutionary, for whom nothing but dream of freedom exists.

Still, we have our great leaders, here and there, in this country and in your country. Generalissimo Changkeshek, President Ngo Din Dien and our President Syngman Rhee, all these great leaders have spent most of their lives as a revolutionary, as an exile in a strange land, dreaming day and night, thinking only of the freedom of their own father-land.

Now, we must learn the morals and the manners of life of our great idaders. Eisenhower may be a great man but he is leader of American people, the people who has richness and whose forefathers, hundred years ago, already had fought for the freedom of their great country.

Youths and Students! Know thyself. Study your situation and the case of your country. Raise up yourself, first and reconstruct your principle of life in order to become a sincere and earnest man who really loves his country

You and I, we all hate Communism which is against human nature, which is a simple barbarism of dark ages. We all know by history that our people had never like the Mongols, the Manchous and the Japanese whose successive invasions into this country have left only tragic footprint. We do not like Communist because he always brings us unhappiness and melancholiness. But we are afraid of him because he is strong and he is doing something day and night. Besides he is very faithful to the orders coming from Moscow.

The Communist, whether it be a Russian, or a Chinese or a Vietnamese, or Philippinoise or a Korean, is strong because he has great faith to conquer the world by Communism. On the other hand, we have too many ideas and too many organizations or associations.

Now, in order to fight against Communism we must be strong, and in order to be strong we must have one idea and one organization, one idea of gaining our freedom back and one organization to make the peope obey to one order.

Lastly I wish you would build up a good result out of this conference in such a way that your people and our people might stand up strongly against the danger of Communism and rebuild up your country and our country.

By this means only we shall have one combined action in inside and outside of our each countries -- that is the Crusade of Asian people against Russian Imperialism and against the barbarous Communism.
