near Mr. President:

On May 23 in Liebon, five nations signed a protocol which opened the way for all five to ratify and become parties to the START Treaty. This historic accomplishment recognizes the essential role of Ukraine in fulfilling the oblightions of the former Soviet Union under the Treaty. replementation of the START Treaty will enhance stability by substantially reducing nuclear weapons and strategic offensive arms and by laying a foundation for further reductions. The United States looks forward to working with Ukraine as a full and equal partner in implementing the freaty and reducing the burden of nuclear weapons that are a legacy of the former Soviet Union.

As part of this agreement, Ukraine will adhere to the yon-Proliferation Treaty in the shortest possible time. This is an important step along the path laid out in the gatement of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine on the on-nuclear status of Ukraine. When the Non-Proliferation Treaty Was negotiated in 1968 the United States formally declared its intention to seek immediate action in the ynited Nations Security Council to provide assistance to any non-nuclear weapons state party that is the object of aggression or threats of aggression in which nuclear weapons are used. Mr. President, let me formally state that the United States stands by that commitment to gkraine.

The United States shares the desire of the other parties to START for security and stability in the region. Implementation of the START reductions in strategic offensive arms will make a major contribution to the security and stability we all seek. In addition, in the new European security environment the security of okraine and other independent state is enhanced through marticipation in international organizations and structures, particularly the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe, the North Atlantic Cooperation Council, and the United Nations. The United States strongly supports the membership of Ukraine in all these organizations, which establish principles and norms that serve as a deterrent to irresponsible or threatening behavior. Adherence to these principles, including the inviolability of borders and the requirement that any change be carried out through peaceful means, will help assure the security of all states.
