Your Excellency,

This Department learns that during the war in Korea, 1950 - 1953, there was created a Korean organisation known as the Korean Service Corps (K.S.C.); the men in the units of this Corps had the duties of carrying food, ammunition, engineer supplies, etc... on their backs from supply dumps to the front line troops.

As this Department intends to form such an organization in the Vietnamese Republican Armed Forces, we would wish to sent to Korea two officers of Captain rank, representing G-I and G-4 of the General Staff, Vietnamese Armed Forces, to study, on the spot, the organisation and experiences of the Korean Service Corps.

The U.S. Military Assistance Advisory Group (MAAG) in Vietnam informed this Office that it would designate an American officer to accompany the two Vietnamese officers.

We should be obliged if you would kindly let us know whether there is any inconvenience for the proposed trip.

In case your Legation would concur in our request, this Department would inform you of the departure date of this team.
