SUBJECT: Computers for Idrael

Last June and October export licences were granted by your departments for two CDC 6400 computers and one IBM 360/65 computer for Israel. One CDC 6400 and the 360/65 were for the Ministry of Defense, and one CDC 6400 for the Hebrew University. These are very powerful computers of major strategic significance. The CDC 6400 in particular is a critical tool in the development of nuclear weapons.
