DRAFT TREASY ON THE MOL-PROLUTINATION OF NUCLEAR WELLONS

(Proamble. Freemble her not yet been drafted. It will express, among other things, the Antenthen of the Parting to achieve the contained of the nuclear and of the Parting to casing of international tensions. It will also include a paragraph reading:

ARTICLE, T.

Each nuclear-weapon State Party to this freaty undertains not to transfer to any recipiont thebseever nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices or control over such weapons or explosive devices directly, or indirectly; and not in any way estist, encourage, or induce any non-nuclear-weapon State to manufacture or otherwise acquire nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices, or control over such weapons or explosive devices.

ARTICLE II

1

Each non-nuclear-weapon State Party to this Treaty undertakes not to receive the transfer from any transferor whatsee of nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices or controover such weapons or explosive devices directly, or indirectly; not to manufacture or otherwise acquire nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices; and not to seek or receive any assistance in the manufacture of nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices. ARTICLE ITT

Each non-nuclear-weepon State Farty to this Treaty undertakes to accept the safeguards of the International Atomic Energy Agoncy on all its peaceful nuclear activities as soon as practicable. Each State Farty to this Treaty undertakes not to provide source or fictionable material, or specialized equipment or non-nuclear material for the processing or use of source or fissionable material or for the production of fissionable material for peaceful purposes to any non-nuclearweapon State unless such material and equipment are subject

ARCTONE IV

1. Any Party to this Presty way propose coordmants to this Trenty. The text of any proposed amondmant shall be submitted to the Depository Determinist which shall circulate it to all Perties to the Trenty. Thereupon, if requested to de so by one third or more of the Parties, the Depository Governable the Parties, to consider such an examinant.

2. Any amondment to this fronty must be approved by a majority of the votes of all the Parties to the Treaty, including the votes of all nuclear-weapon States Party to this Treaty. The amondment shall enter into force for all Ferties upon the deposit of instruments of ratification by a majority of all the Parties, including the instruments of ratification of all nuclear-weapon States Party to this Treaty.

3. Five years after the entry into force of this Treaty, a Conference of Parties shall be held in Geneva, Switzerland, in order to review the operation of the Treaty with a view to assuring that the purposes and provisions of the Treaty are being realized.

1. This Treaty shall be open to all States for signature. Any State which does not algo the Treaty balere its energy into force in accordance processes 3 of this Article say accede to it at any time.

3. This Treaty shall enter into force after its ratification by all nuclear-weapon States signatory to this Treaty, and other signatories to this Preaty and the deposit of their instruments of relationsien.

4. For States whose instruments of ratification or accession are depended subsequent to the entry interforce of this Broaty, it shall enter into force on the date of the depends of their instruments of thatficetion or accession.

5. The Depositary Governmente shall promptly inform all signatory and acceding States of the date of each signature, the date of deposit of each instrument of ratification or of accession, the date of the entry into force of this Treaty, and the date of receipt of any requests for convening a Conference or other notices.

6. This Treaty shall be registered by the Depository Covernments pursuant to Article 102 of the Charter of the United Nations.

ARTICLE VI

This Treaty shall be of unlimited duration. Each Party shall in exercising its national sovereignty have the right to withdrew from the Treaty if it decides that extraordinary events, related to the subject matter of this Treaty, have jeopardized the supreme interests of its country. It shall give notice of such withdramal to all other Parties to the Treaty and to the United Nations Security Council three months in advance. Such notice shall include a statement of the extraordinary events it regards as having jeopardized its supreme interests.
