Dear Mr. Staggers:

The President has asked me to thank you for your letters nos. 79 and 80 both dated September 2. He has immediately instructed us to cable Consul General Nankoong to get in touch with you in regard to the business proposition you have outlined in your letter. There are two traders in New York City at present who were exhibiting their samples in Manada and if they could show you the samples that would save the transportation of samples as suggested by you.

We have immediately made copies of your offer for a hydro-electric power generating plant and the President has instructed the Minister of Commerce to submit his findings.

The **President** was very happy to receive your letters and wishes you to know that as he has so little time to answer your letters he has asked me to write a few lines.
