Dear Mr. Prime Minister:

In your letter of 10 March, you inquire into the details of the assistance being rendered in connection with the Pusan fire disaster.

The efforts to restore the damage in Pusan has been a coordinated operation involving the U. S. Army, ECAC, UMERA, the Recommic Coerdinator, the American-Korean Foundation, and the local civil authorities. The role of the U. S. Army has been to provide emergency relief and to coordinate the plans of other agencies. I am happy to say that the emergency relief phase has been substantially completed and that the development of a rehabilitation plan is proceeding satisfactorily. I am attaching hereto, a sheet to show the extent of some of our accomplishments.

In order to understand the number and extent of the activities for the benefit of Pusan, I would recommend that you visit the city and receive a briefing on the ground by the interested agencies. As I indicated above, the Army's part of the work though presently predominant will progressively diminish, leaving an important long range rehabilitation program to be executed by the relief agencies and the Korean civil authorities. I am sure that General Whitocomb will be most happy to assemble the interested parties and give you a thorough explanation of the plans and progress.

  - b. Widening of Port Road, 100% (planning)
  - c. Drainage of Lake Success, Fill, 17%, drainage structure, 32%
  - d. Repair of Song Do Road, 30%

  - f. Concrete block and tile plant, 90%
  - g. Construction Min. Dong Road, 25%
  - h. Family housing, 17% (1st 100 units)
