Dr. Syngman Rhee, President Republic of Korea, Seoul, Korea.

Dear Dr. Rhee:

Plans are being prepared to send me on another overseas trip. I should like to include Korea in my itinerary if that is agreeable to you. It has been three years since I have been to Korea. Time sure flies.

President Eisenhower, in his acceptance address, said "we have agreements with seven Nations for power reactors". I checked and found the seven were:-

Belgium Australia
Canada France
United Kingdom Switzerland
Netherlands

In addition applications have been received from:-

Brazil Norway
India Italy
Dominican Republic

I have been informed that the rate Korea could manufacture power with a nuclear plant would be five and a half mills or a little more than half a cent. That should be most attractive.
