From the President

I am in receipt of your report No. 95 together with photographs, newspaper cuttings etc. and wish to thank you.

I am very pleased that Dr. Oliver had such a satisfactory visit in Manila and that President Magsaysay was so courteous to him. You certainly have been kept busy with the many people who have visited Manila recently.

The pictures you sent taken with Dr. and Mrs. Harris were very good and I wish to particularly compliment Louisa on how graceful she looks in the Korean gowns.

Mr. Kong Chin Hong called on Minister De Castro and told him that our Government cannot afford to support the five your Filipino delegates to the Anti-Communist Youth Conference to be held here in October, but we do urge the Philippine APAOL to send a large delegation if it is at all possible. The Minister promised to convey this message to Mr. Hernandez on his arrival in Manila.
