After my return to Tokyo, I entrusted the job of investigating the matter to my Japanese contact, who in turn sent his own trusted man to Izuhara, Tsushima to investigate it.

This morning I was informed that the man had returned. His report
was that all the men had in their possession certificates that they
were crew members. However, because police officers were involved
in it he could not investigate deep into the matter.
