I am now drafting a summarization of the Korea-Japan Conference, covering the entire period until the present, including how it started, how it was broken off, what the US attitude was and also what future prospects will be, etc.

When completed, it will be about 50 pages and more pages can be added, if necessary.

I am drafting it in hope that it will be kept as our official record covering the whole period of the Korea-Japan Conference, since there has been no such complete record to date. Of course, I will send the completed draft to your office for your perusal.

Another thought is that separate from the abovementioned summarization, it is possible to prepare another record of about 100 pages for publication, if it meets with your approval.
