Reference is made to the Bureau letter to Los Angeles dated September 11, 1944, and to the Los Angeles letter to the Bureau dated February 9, 1945, both in the above-captioned matter.

It was noted in referenced Bureau letter which set forth information received from the Department concerning the proposed organization for the interchange of American and Soviet films that [redacted] of RKO Pictures, Incorporated, had advised the Department that "on the occasion of his next visit, he expected to be able to submit a concrete arrangement to the Department for a ruling".

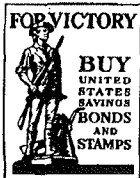
Inasmuch as it appears that RKO anticipates submission to the Department of a statement as to the actual organizational set-up between that corporation and Soviet interests, the New York office is not considering further investigation for the purpose of determining such information.

It appeared in the referenced letter from Los Angeles that the Bureau had requested submission of a closing report in this matter. This case is therefore being considered referred upon completion to the office of origin.
