Polish Government Plans for the Possible

Introduction of Martial Law

1. We have just learned from a reliable source who has excellent access within the Polish military leadership that the current leadership of the Polish United Workers' Party is initiating measures to halt and even reverse current events taking place in Poland. Along with the envisioned changes in the Government, headed by the appointment of Jaruzelski as Prime Minister (who at the same time would retain the portfolio of Minister of Defense), there are hurried preparations being carried out to consider the introduction of Martial Law. On the 13th of February an exercise will be conducted by the leadership organs of the Polish Government in which the decisionmaking processes are rehearsed for the introduction of Martial Law. Conclusions drawn from this exercise will be presented to Kania and Jaruzelski on the 14th of February. In the event that a decision to declare Martial Law is made, plans call for the Polish security forces to conduct a special operation arresting approximately 200 activists of the opposition and Solidarnosc twelve hours before introducing the state of Martial Law. Six hours before introducing the state of Martial Law, Polish troops will enter operations.

- Comment: See FIRDB-312/00339-81, TS #818035, dated 23 January 1981, for a report from the same source entitled "Polish Ministry of Defense Drafting Plans to Utilize the Polish Military to Implement Martial Law", in which Source indicated that the Polish military authorities were preparing contingency plans for implementing Martial Law. This current report indicates that the political preparations are now at an advanced stage. After the "dry run" on Friday the 13th and their critique on Saturday the 14th, a decision whether or when to declare Martial Law could come at any time.]
